Myra - Sauvignon Blanc

Christian Plattner named this wine after his eldest daughter, Miriam, many years ago. Today, he recognizes several qualities that she shares with the Sauvignon Myra.

Miriam is initially reserved. Once she opens up, she is clever, intelligent, and her laughter brightens even the darkest day.

Myra is very similar. It may initially be reserved upon opening, but in the glass, it quickly opens up. It is powerful, filling the mouth, but never overwhelming.

There is another thing that Myra and Miriam have in common. Myra is a single-varietal Sauvignon Blanc, still a relatively young grape variety in South Tyrol. It represents the future - just as Miriam represents the future of Ansitz Waldgries.

Winemaker note:

"I produce the Sauvignon from fully ripe grapes and partially age it in oak to bring a more complex wine to the glass. As a result, the Sauvignon goes excellently with food, is very long-lasting, and, by the way, extremely popular among our customers."

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Variety 100% Sauvignon Blanc

vineyards and climate Appiano Mountain, southeast slope at 550m

above sea-level between the castles of Moos,

Schulthaus and Freudenstein

soils Calcareous loamy soil with a fine mineral structure

Winemaking 80% stainless steel tanks, 20% Tonnau (500 L),

Special feature: a share of the harvested grapes is fermented without crushing and destemming

Serving temperature 9-12°C

Food pairings White and green asparagus, vegetarian dishes,

shellfish and crustaceans, raw fish, light meats

Aging Dark and cool (approx. 12-14°C) with minimum temperature fluctuations

Eye: bright straw yellow with green reflexes

Palate: minerally, salty; an honest wine with elegant acidity; long finish

Nose: complex - from flint notes to elderflower and grapefruit and ripe notes of exotic fruit

Nice to know: The vineyard on Appiano Mountain was acquired by the Plattner family

thirty years ago. As the terroir is ideal

for Sauvignon Blanc, Christian planted his favorite white wine variety here at the turn of the millennium.
