

WUNDER

When I heard from a fellow winegrower that this vineyard was for sale, I could hardly believe it. A steep, south-east facing site with old, deeply rooted vines and a view of the Rosengarten, a unique location. I had to act quickly, as there was, of course, a lot of interest. The wait for a possible commitment seemed endless. When I finally got the go-ahead from the owner, it felt almost like a miracle. It may sound ironic, but I later learned in passing that this farm was historically called Wunder, the German for miracle!

At first, I didn't realize that so much manual work had gone into this steep site. When I tasted the first wines, however, I immediately realised that all that painstaking work had undoubtedly been worth it. Despite the steep location and all of the effort involved, the breathtaking view of one of the most famous mountain massifs in the Dolomites, the Rosengarten/Catinaccio, makes it the most beautiful workplace in the world for me.

Variety 100% Pinot

vineyards and climate Costa di sopra, S. Maddalena, Bolzano steep slopes at 500m above sea level

vinificazione 60% acciaio, 40% tonneau

soils Gravel on porphyry

Winemaking 60% steel, 40% tonneau

Serving temperature 9-12° C

Food pairings Light dishes with fish and poultry, an all-rounder

Aging Dark and cool (approx. 12-14° C), with minimal temperature fluctuations

Eye: bright straw yellow

Nose: spicy and complex, fine, red berries, red currant, white peach, mature pear, citrus fruit, hazelnut

Palate: intense, complex, mineral with alpine freshness

Nice to know: The vineyard at Costa di sopra is family-owned and worked since 2023. It is the steepest and most suitable vineyard for obtaining white wines of great excellence
